Chair Becky Haase welcomed the group.

Rev. Paul Mehl presented a devotion concerning "God's will be done".

Student Government Rep's Jenna Freking & Vera McRoberts reported that they are working on preparations for camp week as it will be different next year with ½ days rather than full days; they are also preparing for the teacher & staff appreciation meal; the dodgeball tournament will be in May.

Minutes from the February meeting were read and approved.

The Treasurer's Report was reviewed and approved.

Director Rev. Paul Mehl reported that the first expenditures from the capital campaign will begin over the summer with the re-paving of the quad, associated parking lots and streets. There will also be new lighting installed around the quad. The HVAC system in Baeppler will be part of the first phase as well, but may not be this summer. Another information system is being investigated in order to try to tie together the various systems such as registration, grading, etc.

Project Review:

Rummage Sale: Rita Fiene reported that the recent rummage sale went well and there was very little left on Saturday to pack up. She gathered a lot of information on how to run the sale. Rita presented a letter for review that she would like to have posted on the SOS Facebook page, which explains the tasks associated with the sale and requests more volunteers. A suggestion was made to use Sign-up Genius to get more people to help. Beth Lange agreed to help get this established. The first collection date will be held Monday, April 1, from 4-8 p.m. and there are enough volunteers at this time.

Saints Store: Rhonda Beerman reported that the store was open 3 times during the times the Norwegian families were visiting and was very successful; there were good sales during the sausage dinner; they plan to be open on Graduation Day; a motion was made and approved to allow Rhonda to get a chip style card reader as it is becoming more and more necessary to have one; Rhonda requested monies to be used for the purchase of heavy coats, which cost around \$90 each with a 15 piece minimum order; a motion was made and approved to allow Rhonda to spend \$2000 on items for the store as she chooses.

Sausage Dinner: Beth Lange reported that the dinner was successful with lots of volunteers making things easy to do; there was little food leftover and it seemed as though attendance was higher this year, however, no official count was taken.

Concert Reception: Jen Isdell reported that the reception went well; there were a lot of cookies leftover but the students enjoyed them greatly the next day; it was agreed that too many was a much better problem than too few.

Old Business:

SOS is in search of volunteers for Secretary, Treasurer and Vice-Chair beginning in May. Kim Blackburn

has agreed to take on the role of Secretary. Jen Isdell is in discussions with someone concerning Treasurer. Vice-Chair is yet to be filled as well.

New Business:

Non-Prom: Becky Haase will contact Dorothy Diamond and see if she is willing to cover this event again this year; it was suggested that students attending non-prom be offered to be taken to a movie or venue out-of-town; Vera McRoberts will see what options the students might be interested in; Becky Haase will see if something can be coordinated for this year.

Awards Banquet: Kent Kunkel reported that someone from his office will coordinate this event and will report again next month.

Becky Haase requested that Rev. Mehl provide a wish list for review by the Exec Board by mid-April so that a proposal for project to be covered by SOS can be made at the April meeting.
